# NEW STUDENT SUCCESS SCHOLARSHIP (S3)

The OFTC Foundation has created a new scholarship designed to benefit the students who currently may not qualify because of GPA. Most scholarships require a 3.0 GPA or higher. The S3 Scholarship is designed to assist currently enrolled students with a GPA of 2.0 to 3.0 and is not campus or program specific. It is the hope of the Foundation that scholarships such as this will allow students to remain enrolled in their program and that financial hardships will be removed.

## Fiscal Year 2024 Distribution

Here's a look at the impactful ways foundation funds were used over the past fiscal year. From providing essential equipment and program materials to supporting scholarships and special initiatives, each dollar spent has played a part in advancing student success and enriching the college community. Here's how your contributions helped make a difference:

The Foundation also offers financial support to the GOAL (student of the year), RPA (instructor of the year) and EAGLE (adult education student of the year) recipients by purchasing necessary interview clothing, giving scholarships, and paying for prizes for the winners.

For **adult learners** earning their high school equivalency (HSE), the Foundation's contributions provided vouchers to cover test fees for their diploma.

Faculty and staff are supported by the Foundation through funding for staff development training, advisory committee meetings meals with community professionals, plus equipment and supplies for the classroom that do not qualify for state dollar funding.

## The IMPACT of Your Gifts

The OFTC Foundation plays a crucial role in supporting OFTC's wide range of programs and services, benefiting students across all levels and backgrounds plus the college's faculty and staff.

By providing funding for scholarships, emergency financial assistance, and resources like textbooks and laptops, the Foundation directly impacts **academic program students** who are pursuing high-demand career pathways. Additionally, it helps **high school students** gain valuable college credits without financial barriers through scholarships and textbooks for each student.

The Foundation also reimbursed all **allied health students** for half of their clinical fees, which are required by each hospital or clinic site where they complete their training. Since each facility mandates its own fees and credentials, these costs can quickly accumulate, creating a potential barrier for students. This support from the Foundation ensures students can pursue their clinical training without being restricted by the financial burden of multiple facility-specific fees.

The Foundation also provides **emergency funds** for unexpected student needs, plus the Last Mile Fund, designed to assist students in their last semester who no longer qualify for financial aid (or the aid will not cover their tuition); student activities funds, and so much more.

During the annual event, select students receive items they need to transition smoothly from education into their careers without the financial strain of purchasing these tools on their own. Items range from stethoscopes and scrubs for healthcare students to welding helmets and toolboxes for those in industrial trades.

In 2024, the TOOLS Program awarded 17 students with these valuable resources, thanks to generous donations from sponsor The Louie and Evelyn Livingston Family Foundation and donors and supporters like Fairview Park Hospital, Morris Bank, Pitts Toyota, the Washington EMC Foundation, and WestRock. While the event usually includes a luncheon and ceremony, this year, due to inclement weather, students were honored through photos and a video, allowing them to still be recognized for their achievements.

Kathy Aaron, OFTC's Executive Director of Institutional Advancement, highlighted the humility and gratitude of the recipients, emphasizing the impact of the program on students' readiness for the workforce. The TOOLS Program not only equips students but also reinforces the mission of OFTC to foster career-ready graduates prepared to succeed.

## Lending Library Programs

OFTC provides students with access to a Lending Library, offering the option to borrow textbooks or laptops for their current term instead of purchasing them. Students can apply for assistance each term, with loaned textbooks or laptops awarded based on financial need. At the end of each term, students return the borrowed items, allowing others to benefit from the resources.

The OFTC Foundation is the sole financial support for the Lending Library through an annual budget allocation, ensuring that students have access to updated textbooks and essential equipment. This initiative, including the laptop lending program, often provides the critical resources students need to stay enrolled and succeed in their studies.
