

Oconee Fall Line Technical College (OFTC) received \$3,405,532.00 from the student portion of CARES Act funding from the U. S. Department of Education. Grants to students totaling the full amount of the allocation were fully expended in March 2023. Grants from these funds were awarded directly to help qualified students specifically with expenses and financial disruptions created by coronavirus including but not limited to financial hardships related to employment, housing, childcare, food, utilities, and medical expenses.

Oconee Fall Line Technical College plan was established and approved by the Technical College System of Georgia in April 2020 to assist students with the greatest need in accordance with federal guidelines. OFTC used tier amounts, where students with the highest determination of need (zero EFC) were awarded the highest tier amount:

1. Tier 1 \$500.00 (0 EFC, Full time)
2. Tier 2 \$450.00 (0 EFC, less than full time)
3. Tier 3 \$400.00 (EFC greater than 0, full time)
4. Tier 4 \$300.00 (EFC greater than 0, less than full time)
