



The Foundation helps celebrate excellence by supporting GOAL (Student of the Year), RPA (Instructor of the Year), EAGLE (Adult Education Student of the Year), and Adult Education TOTY (Teacher of the Year) award recipients with scholarships, professional attire for interviews, and recognition prizes.

To assist **adult learners** working toward a high school equivalency (HSE), the Foundation offers test vouchers that cover required exam fees.

Faculty and staff also benefit from Foundation support through access to professional development, resources for advisory committee engagement, and classroom equipment and supplies not funded by the state.

The IMPACT of Your Gifts

The OFTC Foundation plays a vital role in supporting the college's programs and services, benefiting students, faculty, and staff. By funding scholarships, emergency assistance, and essential resources like textbooks and laptops, the Foundation helps students pursue high-demand career pathways. It also removes barriers for high school students earning college credits by providing scholarships and covering the cost of their textbooks.

The Foundation further supports allied health students by reimbursing half of their clinical fees—expenses required by hospitals and training sites that often vary by facility. These costs can add up quickly and become a barrier, but Foundation assistance ensures students can complete their training without being held back by financial strain.

Beyond academics, the Foundation offers emergency funds for unexpected student needs, the Last Mile Fund for those in their final semesters who no longer qualify for financial aid (or whose aid doesn't fully cover tuition), support for student activities, and many other resources that promote success.

In the college's 2024-2025 annual year, OFTC's Lending Library received 251 applications for books and 144 applications for laptops. The program had resources available to assist 191 students with 193 books and 57 students with laptops.

Donations to the OFTC Foundation directly sustain the Lending Library, a program that eases financial strain for students by providing textbooks and laptops each term. This resource not only reduces upfront costs but also helps students—especially those with limited means—stay enrolled, complete coursework, and move closer to graduation. By expanding access to essential tools, the Foundation ensures every student has the opportunity to succeed.



Lending Library Programs

OFTC's Lending Library allows students to borrow textbooks and laptops each term, easing the cost of education while ensuring access to essential resources. Assistance is provided based on financial need and availability, with items returned at the end of the semester so other students can benefit.

The OFTC Foundation sustains this program through annual budget support, keeping textbooks current and technology accessible. For many students, the Lending Library provides the critical tools needed to stay enrolled, succeed in coursework, and ultimately reach graduation.
